## DCBIA Announces 1<sup>st</sup> Scholarship Recipient to Georgetown University's Master's in Real Estate Program

Talented DC Recipient to Use Georgetown University Degree to Find Solutions for DC's Neighborhood Challenges

(Washington, DC) - The District of Columbia Building Industry Association (DCBIA) announces that Ursula Johnson is the first recipient of a full scholarship to study in the Master of Professional Studies in Real Estate program at Georgetown University School of Continuing Studies, beginning this fall.

In an effort to strengthen DCBIA's community involvement to include education, earlier this year, DCBIA announced a partnership between DCBIA and Georgetown University. With this DCBIA scholarship, Ursula plans to use the Master of Professional Studies in Real Estate degree at Georgetown University to expand her awareness about the many aspects of real estate such as financing and investors, accounting, and construction management.

"My architecture career has provided a glimpse that there are other factors involved when designing a project, beyond visual aesthetics and drawing production," she says. "I want this degree to help me understand how development projects come to fruition so that my design-oriented problem solving can meet the needs of the District's housing and neighborhood challenges."

The scholarship was competitively awarded and selection was made through Georgetown University's admissions program, which included an extensive essay.
